We shifted gears, turning math into a story, and their faces lit up when the numbers started to make sense.

It was in that moment that I saw the power of imagination in learning, and it sparked something deeper in me. I realized my dream isn't just about providing education; it's about making learning an adventure. I want to create spaces where children, no matter where they come from, can discover the magic of knowledge in ways that feel alive to them. A place where a storybook can be as powerful as a textbook, and where kids don't just learn—they dream too.

I may not have all the answers or a grand plan yet, but this interaction reminded me that change often starts with small, genuine moments. Today, it was counting stones and reading stories under the sky. Tomorrow, who knows? Maybe one of these kids will be the next great storyteller, teacher, or leader. That's my dream—to inspire that spark in others and watch it grow into something unstoppable.
